Overview of PE at AO, and the positive impact that the sports funding is having.

Intent: At Ashford Oaks we provide engaging PE lessons that show clear differentiation over the course of each topic in order to suit the needs of each child. Children are exposed to a wide range of sporting activities throughout the year and are beginning to have more of a say on the types of activities that they would like to cover. Our PE curriculum offers a wide range of topics, exposing our children to new skills and challenges. We are fully committed to ensuring that children are given 100+ minutes of PE a week. We attend a local private school for swimming lessons, giving our children the best opportunity to become confident swimmers.

Impact: PE and Sports at Ashford Oaks has continued to grow in stature year on year. Competitions have been well attended and success has been achieved across the year in a number of sports, with children taking great pride when representing the school. After School Sports Clubs have been extremely popular, with the demand for more being clear in our recent pupil voice survey. Outside Agencies have been used to provide additional after school clubs, giving children a chance to attend a number of different sporting clubs. Parental support with children taking part in competitions is excellent and transport is provided to those who are unable to get to the relevant places to take part in competitions. Move & Groove still continues to be a huge part of a weekly routine and therefore will be continuing this year. Move and Groove is a whole school initiative, that allows children and adults to come together, enabling pupils across the school to start the day positively.

Outside Agencies Venture Sports (Gymnastics), BFFA (Football) & Kickstart Sports (Multi Sports) have delivered after school clubs throughout the year. Equipment has been purchased, that both Breakfast and After school club have had access to

New equipment was purchased at the start of year, allowing the new topics to taught. A number of outside agencies have helped in the delivery of after school sport clubs. Children have carried out dodgeball, netball, football, multi sports, dancing and gymnastic clubs through outside agencies or staff members. Clubs have been well sought after with a majority of clubs having a waiting list to join. Relationships have been formed with all the outside agencies with confirmation to continue next year already being agreed. After Oaks and Breakfast club have used a variety of equipment allowing children to start and finish the day being active.

In summary, a large amount of the sports funding has been spent on providing extra-curricular after school clubs and whole school incentives, such as swimming and move & groove. Equipment has been upgraded or replenished when needed and sporting events have been entered with the use of sports funding. We have purchased a new scheme of work (PE Passport), which will further enhance the quality of learning from teaching staff and provide an improved assessment tool. Talks are ongoing on how to spend the remaining funds on improving our outdoor area.
